SEMINAR DESCRIPTIONS / PREREQUISITIES

➤ **Tuesday / Wednesday, January 9/10, 2018 - Masters/International "Short" Sequences**

- These days are for dogs competing or training at the Masters/International level with handlers that have extensive OneMind Dogs handling experience. It is expected you are very familiar with the OneMind Dogs system and techniques.

- Preference will be given to those handlers with National/International experience
- This will be a high intensity, mentally and physically demanding seminar.
- Focus of this seminar is improving your ability to apply multiple techniques throughout a Masters/International level sequence (12-15 obstacles). This will NOT be extra-long course work.

➤ **Thursday / Friday, January 11/12, 2018 – OneMind Dogs Basic Techniques & Application**

- Agility is much like the game of connect the dots. We spend so much more time creating the lines for the dog than the dog spends performing the obstacles. The goal of the One Mind Dogs methodology is to teach the handlers to think about the lines, not the obstacles.
- The benefit of attending a Techniques Seminar is that you will learn how to create the lines for your dog. You will learn the function of each handling technique and where to use them. In addition, you will learn the common errors we see when executing each technique.
- This seminar will also use short sequences highlighting one or two techniques in each sequence to give you the chance to apply your newly learned techniques.
 - **PREREQUISITES:**
 - Open to dogs of any age/experience level; Minimum age: 10 months or with Host's permission
 - Multiple dogs will be on the field working at the same time. We MAY be able to use fencing to separate the four working quadrants, however, in case no barriers are available, all working dogs must be able to work under these conditions
 - Handlers with dogs that are reactive to motion to the extent they will leave their handler, charge after other dogs, and will not recall back immediately must be aware of the following:
 - If you register with a dog that subsequently leaves you and interferes with others, you may forfeit your working spot. No refund will be given.
 - The decision of the instructor and host is final.

➤ **Saturday / Sunday, January 13/14, 2018 – Advanced Techniques & Short Sequences**

- This session will teach some of the more advanced techniques and will use short sequences with multiple techniques
- This session is perfect if you have a good understanding of OneMind Dogs basic techniques and are ready to learn the more advanced ones
- This session is also perfect if you know your OneMind Dogs Techniques but are still working out how/when/where to use them.
- You must have attended at least one (preferably more) Techniques seminar with a certified OneMind Dogs coach to register for this session.
